## Mission



We are also committed to honesty, transparency, and good stewardship of our donors' financial contributions.








# Program Highlights

With the lifting of COVID-19 pandemic movement restrictions in 2022 in both Vietnam and Cambodia, we were able to reach more children who needed us compared to 2021!

On March 1, 2023, we also expanded our operations to Malaysia! Working with a local agent, we provide psychosocial support to child survivors at government shelters, as well as repatriation services to children of Cambodian or Vietnamese origin and offer them our comprehensive services in either country.




### Combined Count in Cambodia & Vietnam








Percentage increase in number of girls that directly benefitted from **OBV** compared to 2021




Percentage increase in number of children/ families that received crisis intervention and/or outreach from OBV compared to 2021

Total revenue: \$102, 256 CAD




- Individual gifts (2.35%) Gifts non-arm's Length (0.01%)


- In previous years, gifts received from donors via CanadaHelps were categorized as "Individual gifts".




Charitable Activities \$66,719 CAD





#### Note regarding reserve fund and investments:

The Board of Directors of One Body Village is committed to ensuring the stability and longevity of the mission, programs, and charitable activities of the organization. In addition, the Board of Directors is obliged to its fiduciary duties to both the beneficiaries and donors of One Body Village through good stewardship and transparent use of funds.

In accordance with its Investment Policy adopted by the Board of Directors on February 12, 2023, the purpose of the above stated reserve fund and short-term/long-term investments is to ensure the viability of the organization by enabling the organization to sustain severe fluctuations in income. The reserve fund is an internal restriction and the use of the funds is at the discretion of the Board of Directors. The fund is not intended to replace a permanent loss of funds or eliminate an ongoing budget gap and any amounts used will be replenished within a year.



Finding child survivors would be impossible without the cooperation and alliance of our local partners, including government agencies and law enforcement.


We will strive to increase our connections in regions across Vietnam, Cambodia, and other regions in Southeast Asia to support children affected by sexual abuse and exploitation.
