Dear friends,

Every year, when I sit down to write this message, I find myself thinking about the same thing: **the sound of a child laughing.**

It may be small and ordinary. In most homes, in most childhoods, it's the background noise of an afternoon. But for the children who come to One Body Village, laughter is not something they arrive with. Rather, it is something they must find their way back to.

This past year, they found their way back over and over again. They found it in classrooms, in kitchens, in gardens, and in each other. They found it on the day one of our girls received her university acceptance letter, holding it with both hands as if it might blow away. They found it in the older girls teaching the younger ones how to braid hair, how to prepare a bánh tét for Tết, how to say a difficult thing out loud without being afraid. They found it in graduations, in birthday cakes shared around our long table, and in the quiet moments after prayer when the house felt full and safe.

None of this would have been possible without you.

When we say that this year we walked alongside more than 300 children across our programs, that 25 young women are now in university, that 173 families received emergency support, that more than 3,000 people attended our prevention workshops in villages where exploitation once went unspoken, we are not reciting numbers. We are describing what your generosity built. Each of those figures is a face and a name, and a childhood being handed back to its rightful owner.

I truly wish you could see what we see. The girl who arrived three years ago unable to look anyone in the eye, now leading her peers in a dance performance. The young girl who once believed she had no future, now dreaming of applying to the best culinary training programs in Vietnam. The little ones who sing loudly, argue about which cartoons are best, and complain about homework, because **they finally get to be children.**

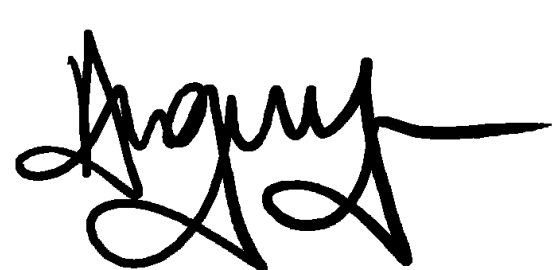

That is your gift to them, and it is one they will carry for the rest of their lives.

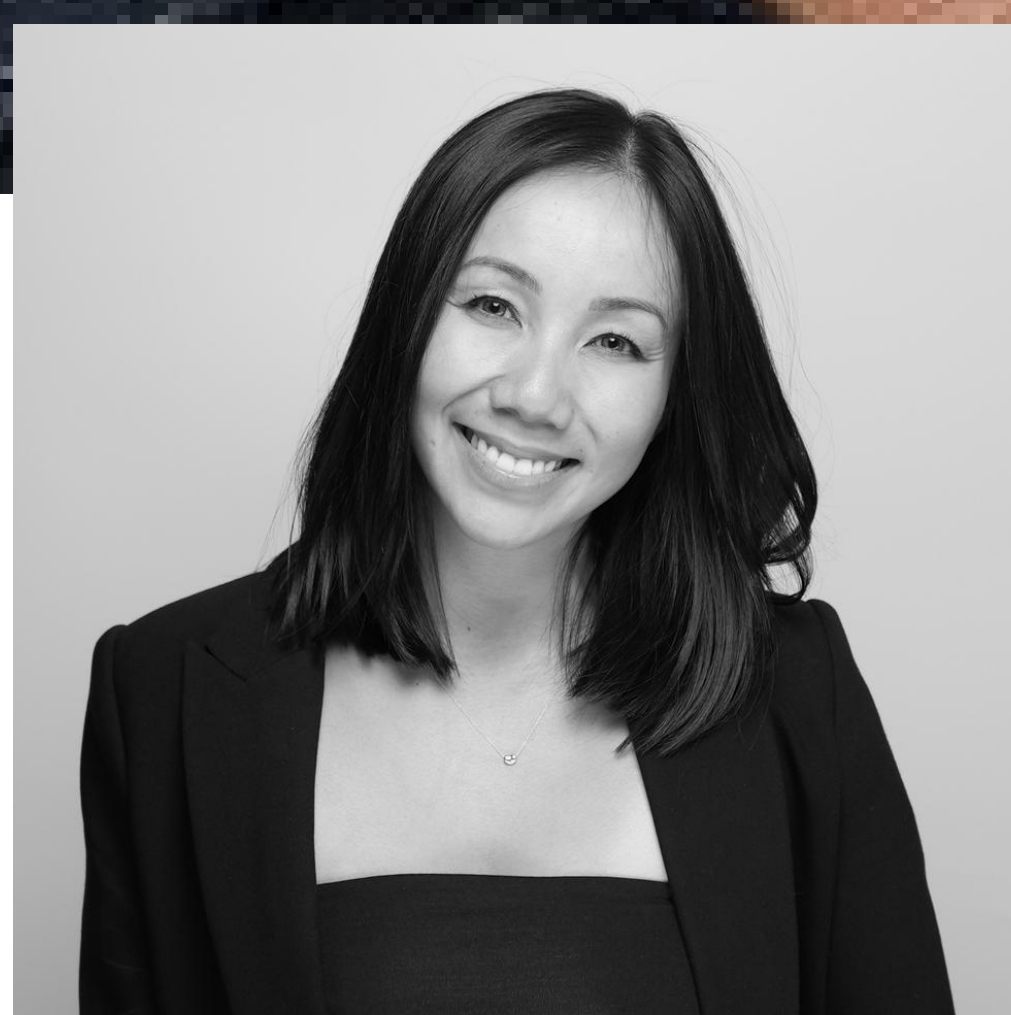

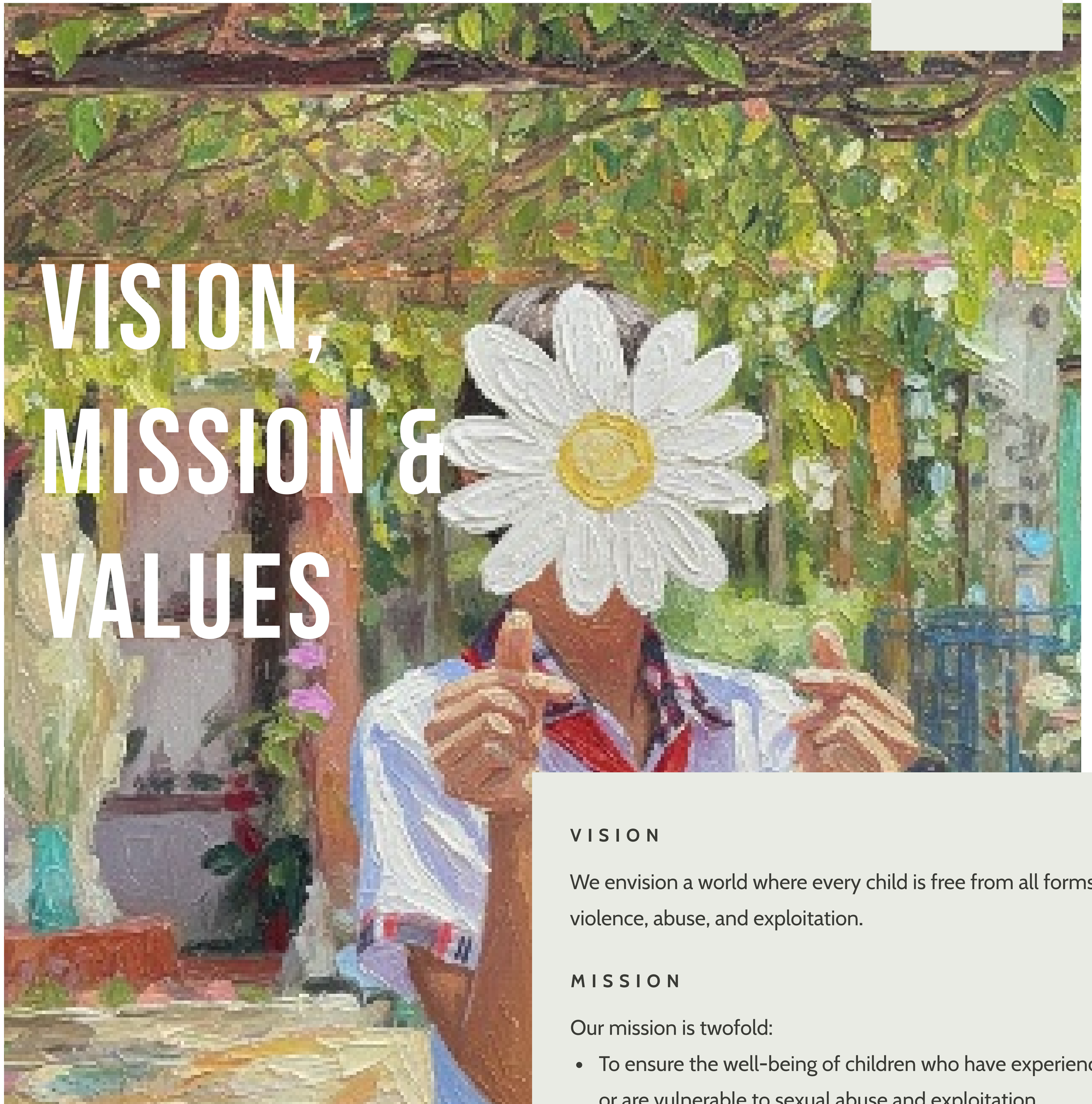

VISION, MISSION & VALUES

VISION

We envision a world where every child is free from all forms of violence, abuse, and exploitation.

MISSION

Our mission is twofold:

- To ensure the well-being of children who have experienced or are vulnerable to sexual abuse and exploitation
- To combat child sexual exploitation and safeguard every child's right to dignity and respect by educating and empowering communities to be catalysts for change.

VALUES

We are committed to honour the value and dignity of all children, their families, and their communities. We are also committed to honesty, transparency, and good stewardship of our donors' financial contributions.



WHAT WE DO

RESCUE

We rescue and provide crisis intervention to high-risk and sexually exploited children through our agents and community partners. We assess each child's needs on a case-by-case basis. In 2025, we traveled over **1,300 km to reach 13 child victims** who needed immediate assistance and case management. Among them, one child found safe sanctuary and is thriving at our confidential shelter in Vietnam.

RESTORE

We provide medical care, psychological counseling, and trauma-informed therapy to child survivors so they can heal physically, emotionally, and spiritually, as well as learn tools to restore their self-esteem, realize their self worth, and rebuild their lives. This program also includes **over 35,000 hours of 24/7 caregiving and behavioural therapy**, provided by our trained and devoted caregivers. In partnership with AusCam Freedom Project, we funded **100 basic counseling and specialized counseling services** to help girls build confidence, develop healthy coping strategies, make informed decisions, and improve their emotional wellbeing and resilience.

REBUILD

To build their confidence and shape their futures, we provide education, vocational training, and life-skills training, free of charge to high-risk and child survivors of sexual abuse and exploitation. **In 2025, one girl graduated high school, three girls started vocational training, and three others successfully transitioned back into their communities, marking important milestones in their journeys.**

RESIST

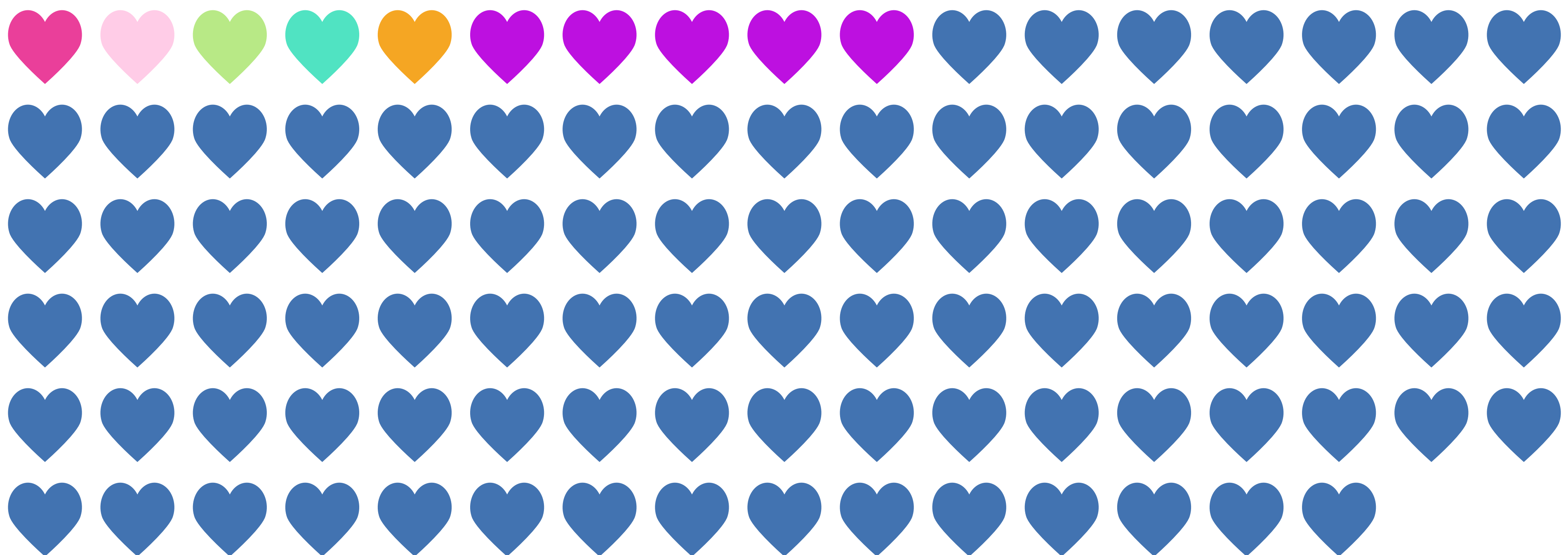
Every child deserves a safe childhood that is free from abuse, exploitation, and trafficking. Through prevention and awareness workshops across Vietnam, Cambodia, and Canada, we equip communities with the knowledge and courage to recognize warning signs, protect vulnerable children, and push back against those who seek to exploit them. **In 2025, we hosted 18 prevention workshops with over 3,000 attendees, a significant increase of 66% from the previous year!**



PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

We proudly serve children in **Vietnam, Cambodia, and other undisclosed regions of Southeast Asia** where resources are limited and widespread poverty, low education, cultural attitudes, lack of protective measures, and pervasive corruption perpetuate the cycle of child sexual abuse and exploitation.

In 2025, **309 children** directly benefitted from our services, including safe shelter, crisis intervention, medical care, education, and vocational training!

In 2025, we raised **\$128,921 CAD** thanks to our generous community of donors, sponsors, and volunteers!



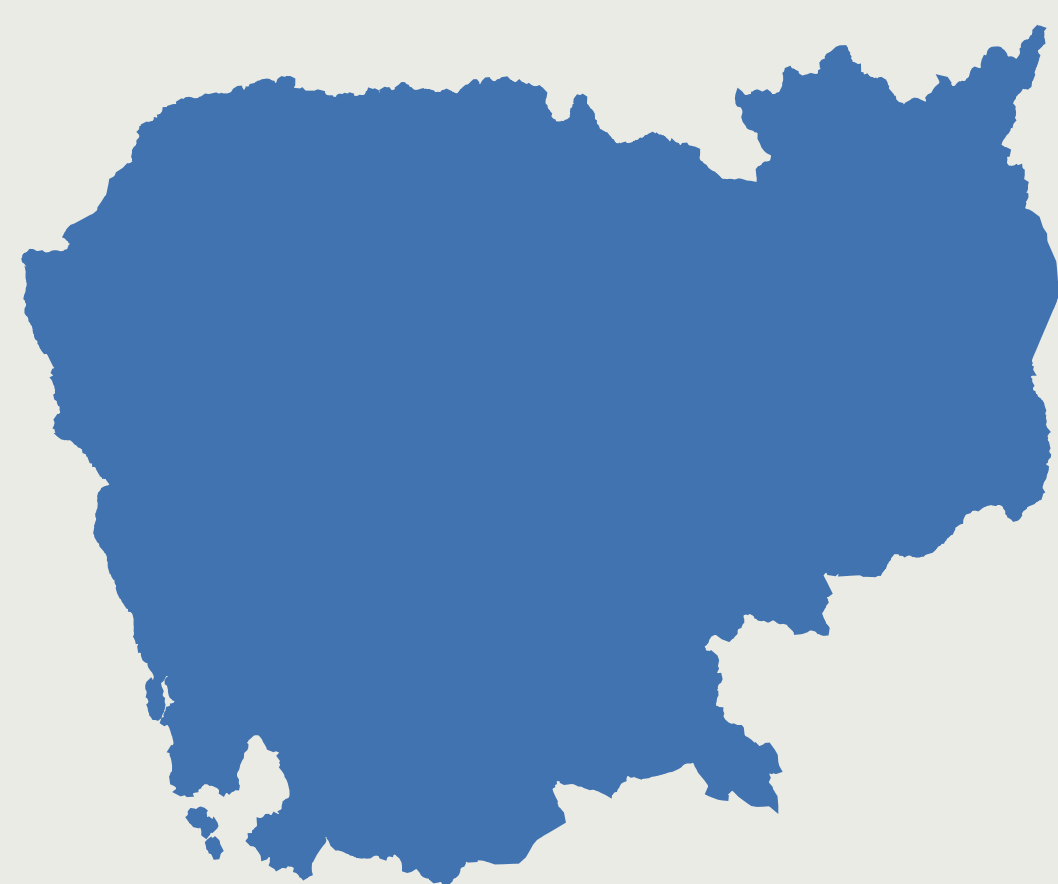
SPECIAL MENTIONS

BY COUNTRY



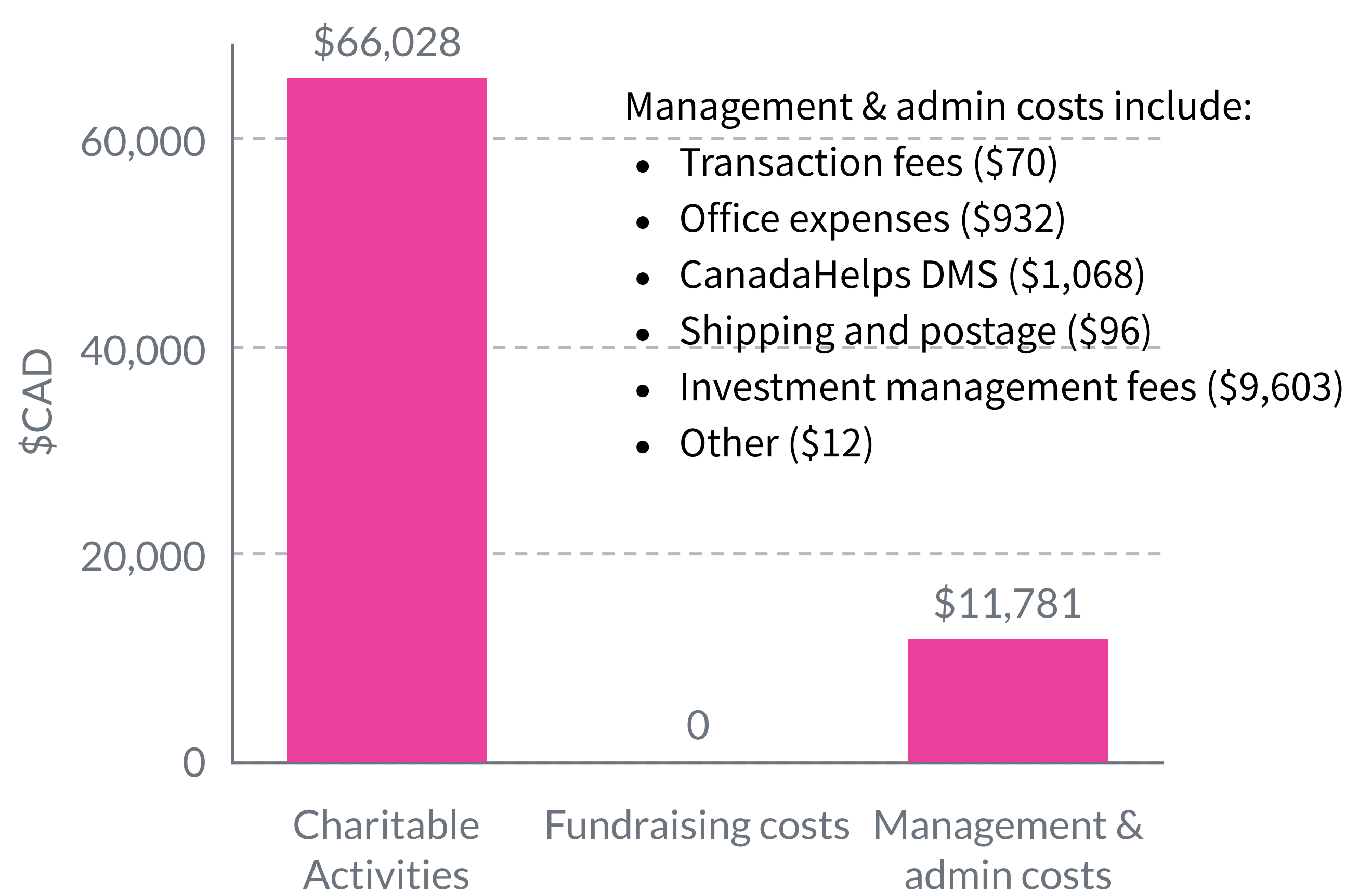
Viet Nam
\$27,141 (41%)



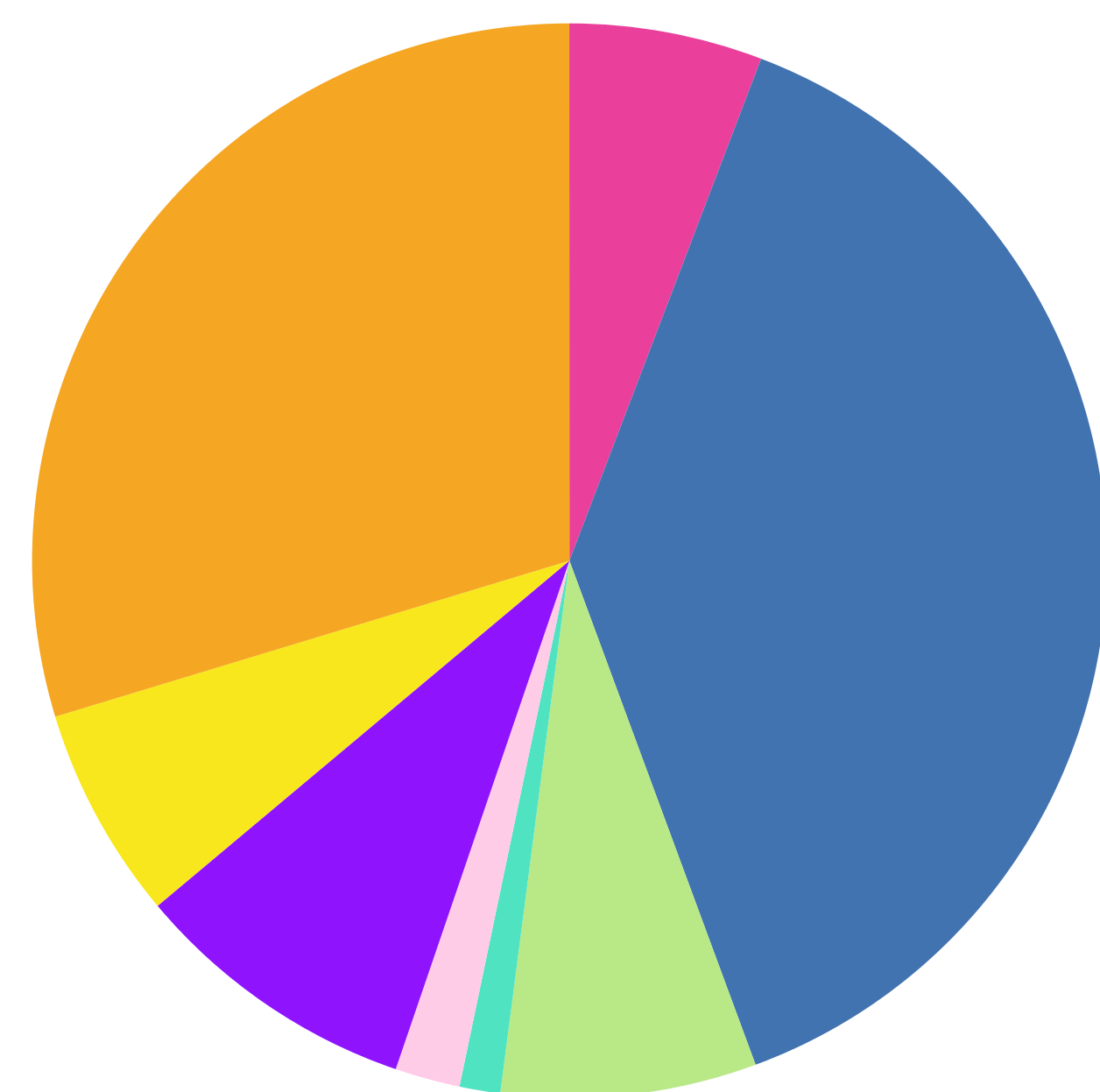
Cambodia

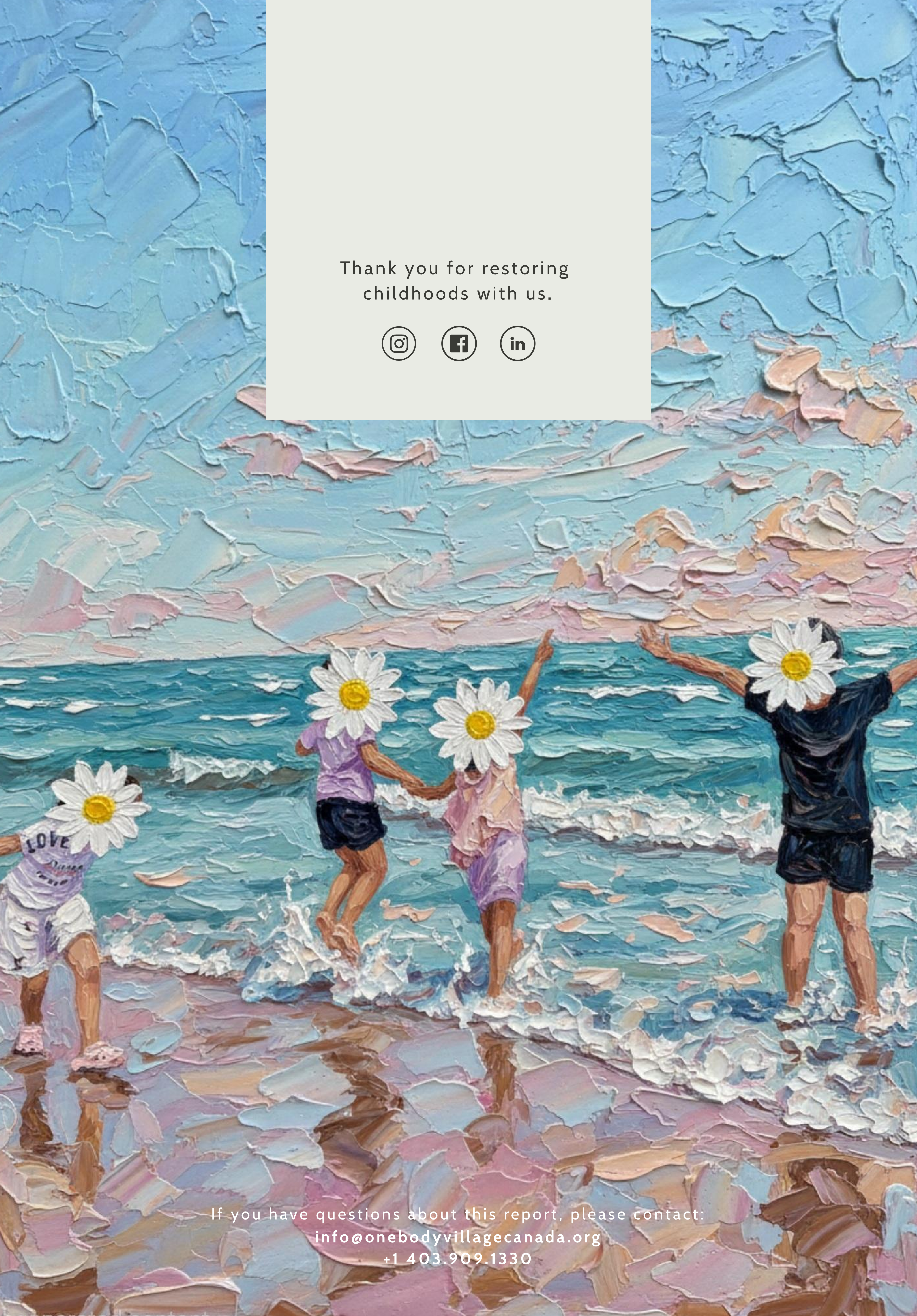
ON THE HORIZON

We proudly walk alongside child survivors of sexual abuse and exploitation, a long journey that may take decades to restore peace and power.

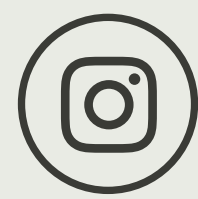
New on the horizon is our goal to support victims and survivors in Canada. Drawing on insights from survivors and frontline workers, we aim to launch a pilot project in early 2027 that will offer emergency funding to victims of sexual exploitation, no matter their age, as we acknowledge that many adult survivors experienced abuse and exploitation in childhood during their most vulnerable years. By filling critical gaps in existing government and social supports, the program will give victims tools and opportunities to secure lasting futures free from abuse and exploitation.

In addition, we remain determined to **establish a social enterprise in Cambodia by 2029** as part of our commitment to creating lasting change for vulnerable girls in Southeast Asia. The enterprise will help girls achieve long-term stability and self-sufficiency by opening doors to quality education, practical skills training, and fair work opportunities.

Your continued support allows us to change the narrative, transform lives, and end child sexual exploitation in Southeast Asia and beyond!
